

Paul Revere's Midnight Ride

In April of 1775, ships filled with soldiers from Britain sailed into Boston harbor. Many people who lived in Boston and nearby towns were afraid of the soldiers.

The people of Boston made a plan. If the soldiers came ashore, someone would go to the towns nearby to warn people by shouting "The British are coming!" A man named Paul Revere volunteered to do this job.

On the night of April 18th, Paul Revere went to a place where he could see the tallest tower in the city. If he saw a light shine from the top of the tower, it was a signal that the British soldiers were coming ashore.

At midnight, he saw the top of the tower light up. He quickly jumped onto his horse and rode to the nearby towns to warn people that the British were coming.
